The horizontal ground plane and the expansive sky create the framework for this residence. These elements are repeated in the horizontal detailing of the materials: cedar, steel and concrete.



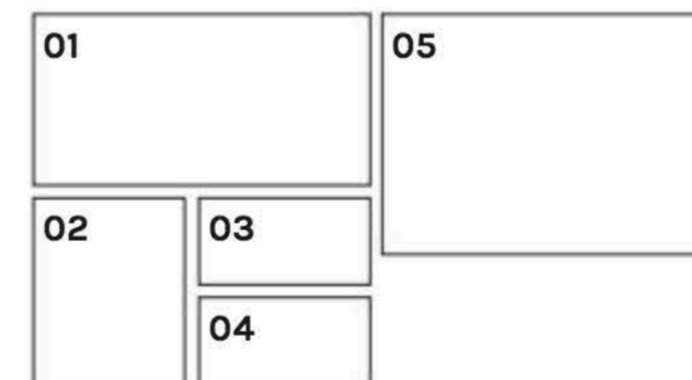
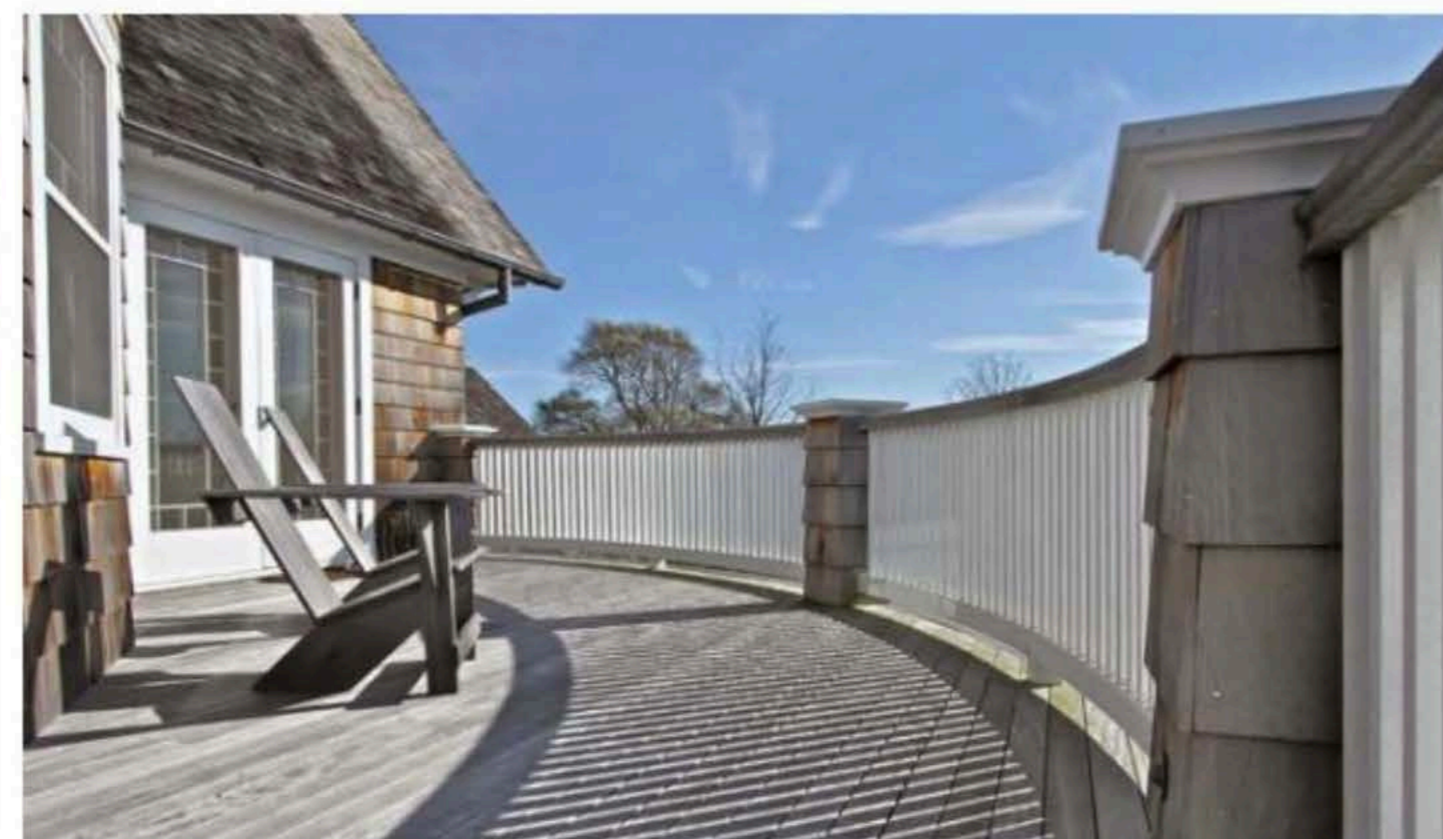
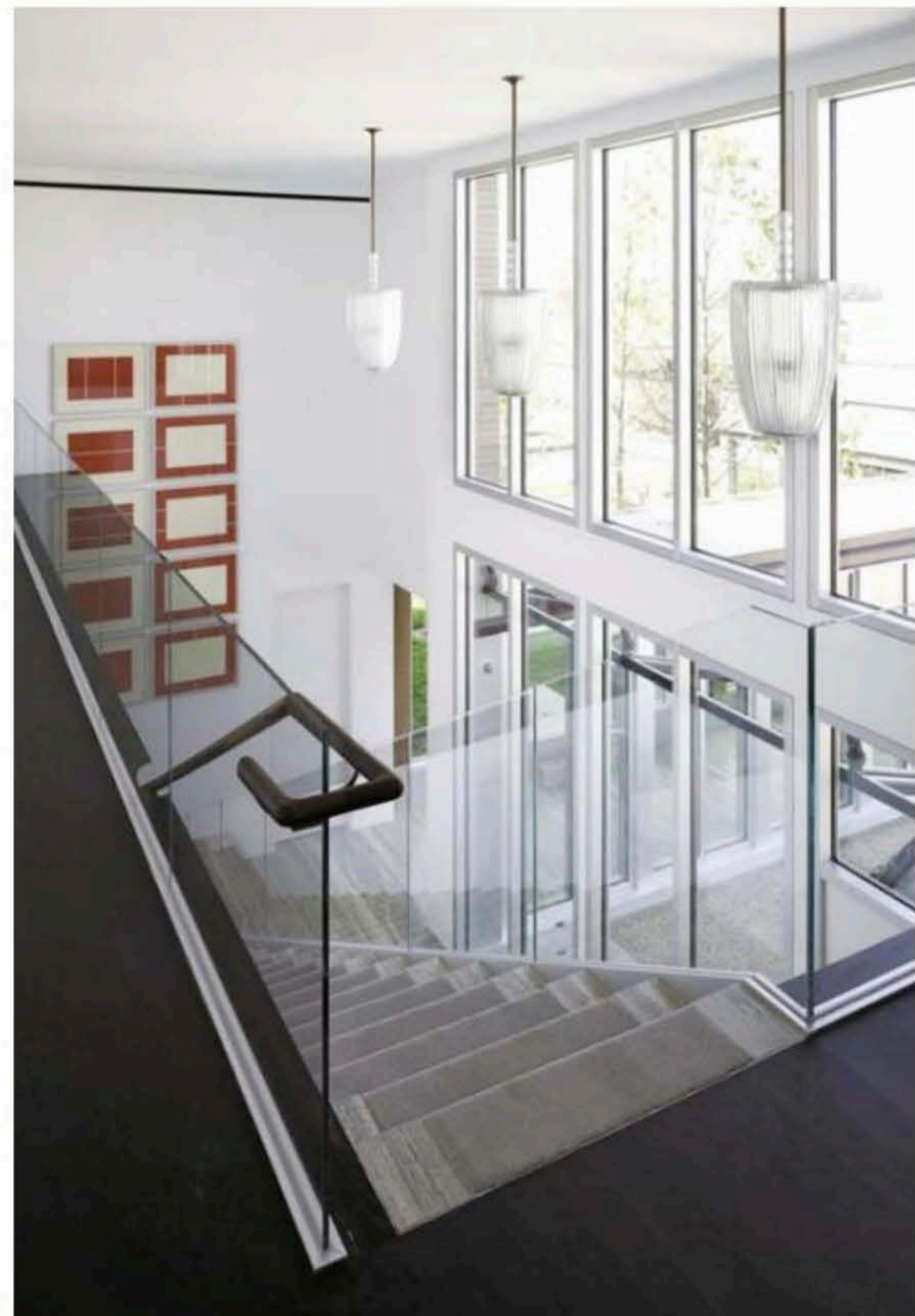
